Showcased on the walls is the evocative work of local artist Stephen Forbes. A Bangor native with exhibitions at the Royal Academy and Royal Hibernian Academy, Forbes' vibrant scenes bring a rich visual flair to the experience.



KEITH HARING

Displayed are iconic works by Keith Haring, the influential 1980s New York artist known for his bold style and focus on themes like sexuality, war, and AIDS awareness. Openly gay and a passionate activist, Haring used art to challenge stigma and spark dialogue, leaving a lasting legacy seen in Pop Shop I and Pop Shop Quad II.

BANKSY

Girl with the Red Balloon, an iconic piece by the elusive British street artist Banksy, known for his striking stencils and sharp social commentary. Blending street and fine art, this powerful image reflects themes of innocence, hope, and loss, hallmarks of Banksy's thought-provoking work.



IAN POLLOCK

A chocolate replica of The Missing Piece honours Dublin-born sculptor Ian Pollock, whose bronze works reflect a personal and evolving journey. Self-taught and known for his craftsmanship, he has exhibited widely and won awards including the Mullan Prize for Sculpture.
